LIVING WITH COVID

We have now entered our third year of operating in a COVID environment and managing the multitude of challenges is a constant challenge.

While wearing masks is no longer required, we are still requiring our Support Workers to continue to wear their mask when providing services to protect you and our staff as much as possible.

The opening of the borders has increased the number of clients and staff who are affected by COVID. Since early March, more than 60% of staff and their families have been affected by COVID.

We are finding that recruitment of staff has become easier since the opening of the borders and our HR Co-ordinator is busy building our staffing capacity to ensure that we are off and flying for the rest of the year.

Our staff do not come to work if they are unwell or have an unwell family member. This may result in an alternative support worker coming to do your service. Please continue to be patient while we work through these disruptions. We are all very grateful that our transition through COVID has been much easier than our eastern counterparts.
